Sponsors a Tree for a Year

Cool Earth fundraisers continue to inspire and impress us.

Setting a target of 211 miles, brothers Callan and Campbell had a long walk ahead of them. The hike, which usually takes walkers approximately three to four weeks to complete, passes through Yosemite National Park, and culminates at the highest peak in continental United States, Mount Whitney. By combining this fundraiser and trek with a charity that friends and families wanted to get behind was more than enough incentive for people to donate - they raised over \$3000!

Committed to raising money for climate action, Conor O'Loan completed an impressive 150km bike ride around Richmond park during lockdown. Although his friends and family stayed at home, they all came together to sponsor him and make a difference, raising £1000 for our rainforest partnerships. Conor chose to fundraise for Cool Earth to take effective climate action supporting local people to keep their trees standing.

He creates and sells paintings of endangered birds to spread awareness and raise money for Cool Earth - helping to protect the rainforest that these beautiful birds call home.

Choose your fundraising activity or theme
Get a date in the diary
Set yourself a target
Create a fundraising page and personalise it (JustGiving)
Spread the word - tell everyone and their nan! Let people know how you're getting on by updating your fundraising page or sharing on social media
Remind people about GiftAid If your supporters are UK taxpayers and are happy for us to claim GiftAid on their behalf, an extra 25p from each £1 raised can be added at no extra cost.

THE LEGAL BITS

Responsibility for your event

The key thing to remember is that you are responsible for your fundraising event, meaning you must make sure that it is carried out safely and legally. Cool Earth cannot accept any liability for your fundraising activities. Make sure it's clear that your event is fundraising 'in aid of' rather than organised by Cool Earth.

Insurance

You'll need to take out appropriate insurance to cover your liability for certain fundraising events. If your event is open to the public, or has public participation, we recommend that you have public liability insurance as a minimum.

If you are hiring a venue, it's worth checking to see if the venue already has insurance, and if you're fundraising at work, ask your company what insurance cover they have.

Photography and filming

Sharing photographs and videos of your fundraising online can help boost donations, but remember to always ask permission from the photographer to share images taken, and from others if they feature in images and video. If children feature prominently in photos taken at your fundraiser, you will need parental consent for the photos to be taken. Cool Earth can supply you with consent forms for this.

Collection tins

From supermarket collections to football matches, collection tins and buckets are great for raising funds, and awareness. If you're collecting funds in a public place you'll need to apply to your local council for a permit. For private collections in the UK, you don't need permission from the local authority but please remember to seek permission from the owner of the building or location. Cool Earth does not endorse door to door fundraising.

When you're collecting money, ensure that funds are kept safe and secure. It's good practice for two people to be present when the money is counted and cash should be banked as soon as possible after the event.

THE LEGAL BITS

Raffles & lotteries

Raffles can be a brilliant way to raise money, but there are laws and guidance relating to any form of gambling, including raffles and lotteries. To ensure your event is legal and as successful as possible, please follow guidelines from the Gambling Commission.

Brand

Our short set of guidelines is designed to accompany our downloadable resources, including images and our logo. Please take a moment to read through, as it is important they are used to their best effect and in accordance with the Cool Earth brand.

Food

Please take care when storing, handling and preparing food. Remember to follow basic food hygiene advice and obtain any necessary licences to sell food. You can find more advice from the Food Standards Agency.

COVID-19

Before you start planning your activity, make sure you can do it safely and within government coronavirus guidance. Please don't take part in any fundraising activities if you're feeling unwell.
